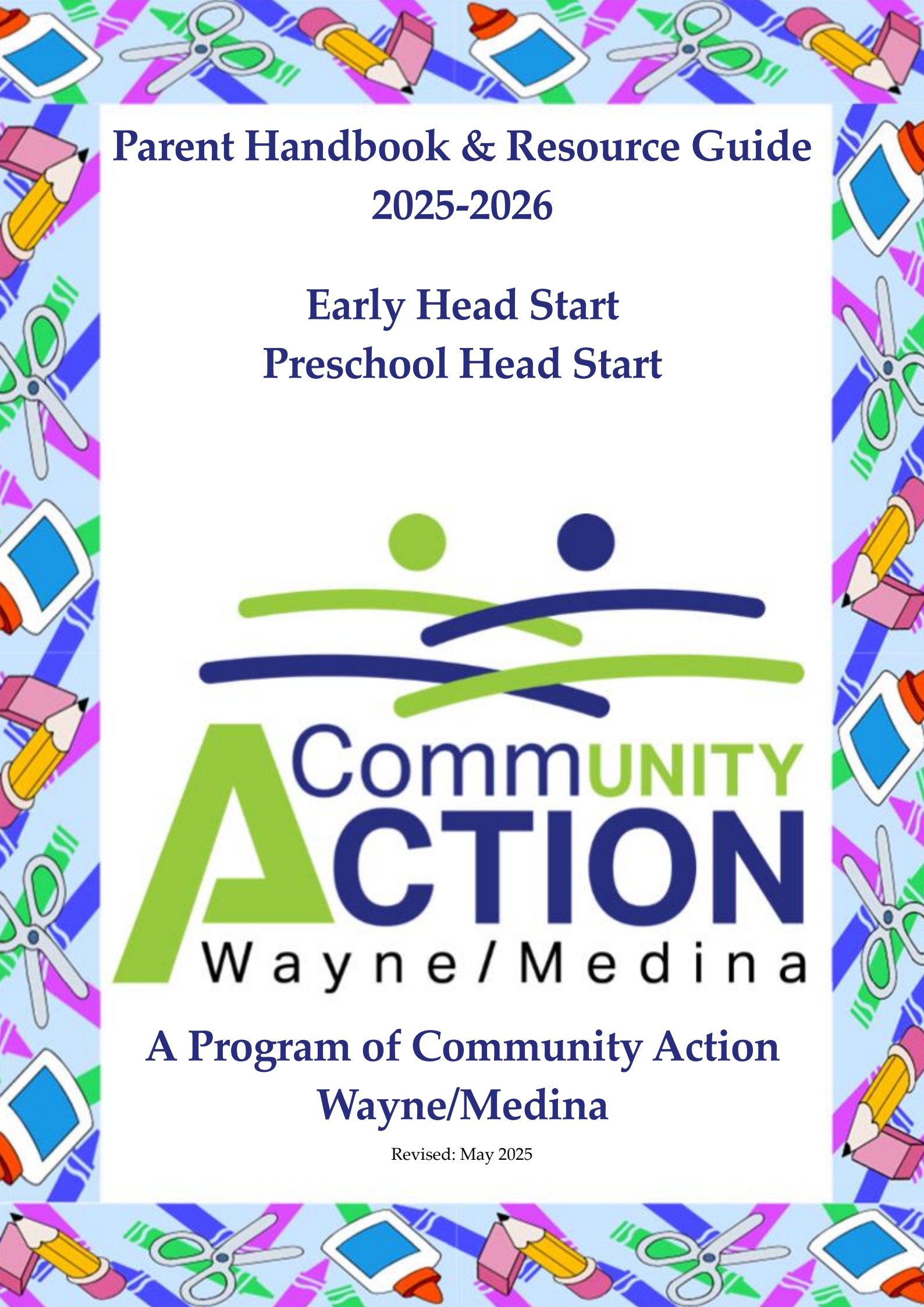

General Information

Mission Statement

“We strengthen the community through collaborations and services by promoting self-sufficiency, household stability, and family and childhood education.”

The Head Start Program of Community Action Wayne/Medina is dedicated to easing the effects of poverty by providing a rich variety of high-quality experiences for the intellectual, emotional, social, and physical growth of each child. Further, each parent will be given opportunities for growth in self-sufficiency, self-esteem, child development knowledge, and school readiness.

Head Start’s mission is carried out through:

- A system of excellent staff that is attentive to the individual needs of the family
- Focused leadership
- The cooperative support of parents and the community-at-large
- Parental input to support and improve our program
- Family engagement with parents/guardians

Philosophy

We believe that a ‘connected community,’ in which all members are free from harm and have access to support and quality information, will provide unlimited opportunity and respect for all who live here.

We believe successful experiences are the direct result of continuous learning for each child, parent and staff member, and are based on child-parent-staff-community partnerships.

We believe physical and mental health is the basis for achieving a high quality of life. Our community will thrive when all individuals and families benefit from full access to nutritional food, safe shelter, medical, dental, and mental health care.

We believe quality education provides knowledge for adaptation to change and creates opportunity for self-sufficiency and guides leadership. All children thrive when individuals develop appreciation for all cultures, building a community that meets its peoples’ needs.

Mandated Reporters of Child Abuse & Neglect

Community Action Wayne/Medina staff are required by law to report suspected abuse and neglect to their local child protective service agency. All agency staff shall report or cause a report to be made in any suspected child abuse/neglect as so stated under the law. (Ohio Revised Code 2151.421).

Mandated Reporters of Elder Abuse & Neglect

Community Action Wayne/Medina staff are required by law to report suspected abuse and neglect to their local department of job and family services. All agency staff shall report or cause a report to be made in any suspected child abuse/neglect as so stated under the law. (Ohio Revised Code 5101.63).

Mandated Reporters of Animal Abuse & Neglect

In accordance with Ohio House Bill 33, Community Action Wayne/Medina staff are required by law to report suspected animal abuse and neglect. Any suspicions of animal abuse/neglect will be reported to the local authority. (Ohio Revised Code 959.07)

Nondiscrimination Clause

It shall be unlawful for CAW/M and its staff to discriminate in the enrollment of children and families in the childcare center upon the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or disability. The program affirms its commitment to comply with Title IV of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Part 80, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 Subpart B and National Head Start Regulations. The program will make every effort to provide "reasonable accommodations" to insure no person on the grounds of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, or disability in violation of ADA Act of 1990, be excluded from participation in program services, or be subject to discrimination under activities sponsored by Community Action Wayne/Medina.

Community Action Wayne/Medina Governing Boards

Community Action Wayne/Medina is governed by two entities, the CAW/M Governing Board and Policy Council.

The Governing Board members are elected members of the community, and two Policy Council representatives (1 from each county). The Governing Board is responsible to set policy, review budgets, approve grants, advocate for families and determine broad goals for all the programs at Community Action Wayne/Medina.

Policy Council (PC) is represented by parents of currently enrolled children and members of the community. The job of Policy Council is to represent all enrolled families in their decisions around program direction.

In addition to the governing board, and the policy council, Head Start individual programs are represented by a parent committee. All enrolled families are a member of the parent committee, and have the opportunity to elect Policy Council representatives, and plan program events.

Program Practice

CAW/M maintains a weapon/smoking/drug/alcohol free facility at every location. All violations will be handled accordingly. Depending on the nature of the violation, individuals may be excluded from future program activities.

Head Start staff are unable to participate on a personal level with families in any online social media platform.

Head Start rules do not allow staff to receive gifts from families. Here are some other ways you can show the staff your appreciation:

- Thank-you cards/letter to staff or submitted in newsletter.
- Volunteering or donating books/ supplies.
- Write a note to your elected congressman about your appreciation of Head Start or what Head Start means to you (the staff at your center can give you the address or website).

Scheduled closings throughout the program year can be located at each center. This information will be shared with families and posted on site near the classroom.

If a center is closed unexpectedly, families will be notified by text/email/phone call as soon as possible.

CAW/M will not suspend, un-enroll or expel a child due to their behavior. For behavior that results in incidents towards other children/staff, staff will complete Incident Reports following the ODCY procedure. When a child exhibits persistent and severe challenging behaviors, documentation of incidents will be used when developing a Child and Family Support Plan alongside the child's parents, a mental health consultant, the child's teacher(s), and using the child's IFSP/IEP if applicable. Staff will review the Child and Family Support Plan in an agreed upon timeframe to determine if any changes need to be made. As a last resort, CAW/M staff including education, mental health services, family engagement services, directors and managers will determine if CAW/M is the best placement for the child. If it is determined that CAW/M is not the best placement, staff will assist the family in seeking alternate program options.

Program Guidelines

Pregnant women and newborns to five-year-old children, who meet eligibility guidelines can apply for the Early Head Start/Head Start program. There is no registration fee to apply for the Head Start program. To be eligible for the Full Day Child Care option, childcare subsidy authorization must be obtained from the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. A family is required to pay the copayment assigned by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. Please contact CAW/M's fiscal department at 330-264-8677 for any questions on invoicing.

Ten percent (10%) of the enrollment is reserved for families who are above the income guidelines. An additional ten percent (10%) of our enrollment is reserved for children with disabilities. At least 55% of our enrolled children/families must meet 100% of the Poverty Guidelines to qualify, and 35% may be accepted for enrollment up to 130% of the Poverty Guidelines once all the lower income families are served. Children are accepted using our Enrollment Guidelines.

Parents/guardians must provide proof of income to be considered for enrollment.

Parents/guardians are required to sign their child in and out of school daily. Parents/guardians will indicate on the "Release of Child" form additional adults who can pick up their child. A State Issued Photo ID must be presented to staff before the child is released. If an event occurs that prevents the parent/guardian and individuals listed on the "Release of Child" form, the parent/guardian will verbally give consent, a code word, and the name of the individual picking up to staff. The individual picking up will need to give staff the code word, and a State Issued Photo ID prior to the child being released. In the event of a custody agreement (i.e., shared parenting), the agency will follow the custody agreement as to who is allowed to pick up children. If changes are made to the custody agreement, parents/guardians need to bring the most recent custody agreement to the center and inform the Family Service Specialist so a copy can be added to their child's file and staff are informed of any changes.

Children need to attend as much as possible for their family to gain the maximum benefit from the program. If children/families are unable to attend classes or home visits, please call the center or Family Visitor. All missed home visits must be rescheduled to the extent possible.

If a child is unexpectedly absent/misses a home visit, the agency will call to check on the safety and wellbeing of the family. If a child is scheduled to arrive from another program and does not, the agency will call to check on the safety and wellbeing of the family. If a child has missed two consecutive days/visits, then the agency will conduct a home visit and provide services, as necessary, to promote/improve regular attendance. If there is no consistent improvement, the child may be dropped from the program. CAW/M reserves the right to discontinue enrollment due to a lack of regular attendance.

If the parent does not pick up a child within five minutes of the end of class, staff will contact the parent or emergency contacts. If a child is not picked up and there has been no contact with the parent/guardian after one hour, staff will contact the local police department.

Health

The following health screenings and examinations are required by ODCY licensing (Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment Schedule) and/or Head Start. Please contact the Family Service Specialist/Family Visitor with any questions or concerns about health needs.

- All children are required to have their recent physical and immunizations within 30 days of enrollment to participate in the program. Children in center-based programs without medical

documentation (physical and/or immunization record only) on file within the first 30 days of enrollment will be placed on hold out for a maximum of 14 days (2 weeks). If the medical record is still not received within this time period, the child will be dropped from the program.

- If a child is exempt from immunizations, required paperwork must be on file
 - The following are circumstances in which a child may not receive immunizations:
 - A statement from physician that an immunization against the disease is medically contraindicated for the child
 - A statement from physician that an immunization against the disease is not medically appropriate for the child's age
 - A statement from the child's parent/guardian that he or she has declined to have their child immunized against the disease for reasons of conscience, including religious convictions.
 - Staff can notify RN via e-mail to access Ohio Impact SIIS for immunization results.
- Hearing screenings, vision screenings, and growth assessments (heights/weights) are required within 30 days of enrollment.
- Hemoglobin and lead screenings are 90-day requirements.
- Children age 3 and up and pregnant women require documentation of a dental exam by a dentist during the program year.
- An oral health risk assessment for infants and toddlers will be part of your child's Well Child Exam with their pediatrician.

Communicable Disease

Staff are formally trained in communicable disease prevention from ODCY Communicable Disease Curriculum, including the proper diaper-changing procedures. Our staff will perform daily health checks on children when they arrive at the center/socialization.

A child is considered to be sick when demonstrating any of the following symptoms:

- Temperature of at least one hundred- and one-degrees Fahrenheit (one hundred degrees Fahrenheit if taken axillary) when in combination with any other sign or symptom of illness.
- Diarrhea (three or more abnormal, unexpectedly or unexplained loose stools within a twenty-four-hour period).
- Severe coughing, causes the child to become red or blue in the face or to make a whooping sound.
- Difficult or rapid breathing.
- Yellowish skin or eyes.
- Redness of the eye or eyelid, thick and purulent (pus) eye discharge, matted eyelashes, burning, itching or eye pain.
- Untreated infected skin patches, unusual spots or rashes.
- Unusually dark urine and /or gray or white stool.
- Stiff neck with elevated temperature.
- Evidence of untreated lice, scabies, or other parasitic infestations.
- Sore throat or difficulty swallowing.

- Vomiting more than once or when accompanied by any other sign or symptom of illness.
- If live lice are found, then parent/guardian will be notified, and the child should be picked up as soon as possible. Child can return the next day after a single treatment and free of live lice.

When caring for sick children, the center shall:

- Isolate the sick child away from other children, but within sight and hearing at all times
- Provide the sick child with a cot/mat and make comfortable
- Notify the child's parent(s) immediately to arrange discharge and if the child's condition worsens
- Clean and sanitize all bedding, toys, and other items used by the sick child before being used by another child.
- Sanitize the thermometer after each use.

The childcare centers shall follow state of emergency guidelines from the state of Ohio and /or ODCY when issued for transitional care when needed.

Children who display symptoms for a specific illness listed on the chart above will not be allowed to return to the classroom until the minimum return-to-class criteria are met for that illness:

- A physician's note stating that the symptoms are no longer contagious.
- For the mildly ill child, exclusion from the classroom/home visit/socialization will be based on the same guidelines listed on the communicable disease chart and according to exclusion guidelines from the state.

Parents/guardians should notify the program staff within 24 hours after their child has developed a suspected communicable disease, or if any member of the immediate household has been diagnosed with a communicable disease. If a parent or physician notifies CAW/M that a child has a communicable disease, parents with children in the childcare classroom/program (depending on exposure) will be notified. Letters/flyers will be sent home to inform parents of the signs and symptoms to watch for regarding the reported communicable disease mentioned above. A copy of the ODCY "Communicable Disease Chart" is posted in each center.

Medications/Topical Products/Modified Diets

Children who require medications/medical foods, topical products, modified diets, and food supplements must have all required paperwork on file before attending socializations or participating in the classroom. Our staff will not give medications at the center unless medically necessary. The family will administer any medication before and after school whenever possible. If a child takes medications at home, parents need to notify the Teacher, as the child's behavior can be affected. Elimination of a food item for cultural, religious, and/or philosophical reason(s) are accommodated with guidance from a parent/guardian.

CAW/M Head Start requires all children with a diagnosed medical chronic condition that have a current prescribed rescue medication must have access to the rescue medication while in attendance in according to ODCY regulations.

CAW/M will ensure compliance with the American with Disabilities Act (ADA), including:

- Administering medication to children with disabilities.
- Administering care procedures to children with disabilities.

CAW/M will look at each individual care plan regarding care procedures, administration of medication/topical products and the need to include medical food and modified diets.

Emergency Plans

In the event of an incident, a medical, dental, and general emergency plan is posted by the telephone with instructions for staff to follow. Staff are trained in safety prevention and have the necessary support tools at hand, when needed.

Staff will complete a report when an incident/injury/illness occurs during program hours and will provide families with a copy of the report. Families will be notified at the time of a serious incident/injury/illness, and if the incident requires emergency transportation. If a child is transported by a rescue squad for emergency treatment, the child's health information and release forms will accompany the child. If a parent/guardian does not wish to give CAW/M permission to secure emergency transportation, families must sign a Refusal for Emergency Transport form.

If a center must be evacuated due to an emergency, children and adults go to their primary evacuation location. There will be a designated secondary evacuation location in the event that staff and children cannot reenter the center. Families will be called, and children will be picked up at this location. These locations will be provided to families at enrollment time, as well as procedures for the evacuation and pick up.

Due to the location of services, it may be necessary to close centers and/or cancel class sessions due to weather-related level emergencies. If the county your child's center is located in is under a level two or level three weather emergencies, the center will be closed. For families involved in the home base program, visits will be cancelled at a level 2 emergency, and visits will resume once the level 2 is lifted. All visits will be cancelled at a level 3 emergency. For circumstances not related to weather-related level emergencies, the decision will be made by Management and will be communicated to families via text/phone as soon as possible.

If the public school district, where your child's center is located, closes or delays due to inclement weather conditions CAWM may delay the start of classes two hours. This will allow time for road maintenance for safe travels of staff and families. You will be notified through the BLOOMZ communication app for closures and delays.

Nutrition Services

Children are served family style meals that teach them how to set the table, pass items, practice table manners, and clean- up after the meal. This allows them to continue to develop self-help skills, social/emotional skills, and fine motor skills.

Children are encouraged to taste new foods to promote healthy eating. Food served during meals is developmentally appropriate in size, amount, and texture to prevent choking. Menus are available at all sites.

The childcare centers shall follow state of emergency guidelines from the state of Ohio and/or ODCY when issued for transitional care when needed.

Community Action Wayne/Medina participates in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), which is a no cost nutritional program offered through the USDA.

The Head Start program is required to follow Child and Adult Care Food Program guidelines and ODCY rules for meal service. These meals will consist of the following:

A breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snack for full day program

A snack is provided at socializations for all enrolled children

The combination of meals contains:

Vitamin C source every day

Whole Grain Rich source every day

Vitamin A source every other day

Low in fat, salt, and sugar.

The foods for these meals will be chosen from the five basic food groups to include:

Special Events/Food from Outside Sources

All food served and consumed during operating hours must be prepared in Head Start kitchens that are licensed by the Ohio Department of Health and the Ohio Department of Agriculture. During special events (birthdays, festivals, etc.) families are asked to not bring food from outside sources to Head Start centers or events.

Building for the Future

This childcare facility participates in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), a federal program that provides healthy meals and snacks to children receiving day care.

Each day millions of children participate in CACFP at childcare homes and centers across the country. Providers are reimbursed for serving nutritious meals which meet USDA requirements. The program plays a vital role in improving the quality of day care and making it more affordable for low-income families.

- **Child Care Centers:** Licensed or approved public or private nonprofit childcare centers, Head Start programs, and some for-profit centers.
- **Family Child Care Homes:** Licensed private homes.
- **After School Care Programs:** Centers in low-income areas provide free snack and/or meal to school-age children and youth.
- **Emergency Shelters:** Programs providing meals to homeless children.

Eligibility: State agencies reimburse facilities that offer non-residential day care to the following children:

- Children aged 12 and under,
- Migrant children aged 15 and younger, and
- Youths through 18 in emergency shelters and after school care programs in needy areas.

Education Services

Head Start Daily Schedule

Each classroom creates a structured daily schedule to establish a routine for the children. These schedules are flexible, as necessary, to allow for adaptability. Each center will provide a detailed schedule to their families at enrollment. Children should view their school as a safe, comforting place where they know what is expected and when to expect it. A typical day would include:

Part Year/Full Day and Full Year/Full Day

Arrival Activities Meal

Intentional Play/Gross Motor Group Times

Meal

Quiet Activities (if applicable) Intentional Play/Gross Motor Group Times

Meal

Departure Activities

Our Part Year/Full Day option will have a 30 minute-1 ½ hour quiet period offered within one hour after lunch concludes. All children will be assigned a mat/cot that will be available to them for resting/sleeping. Children who fall asleep will be able to remain on their mat /cot for the duration of the 1 ½ time block.

Full Year/Full Day option will have a two-hour nap period in the afternoon. All children will be assigned a cot/mat for resting/sleeping that will be available to them for resting/sleeping. Quiet activities will be offered to children who remain awake during the 2-hour time block. Any child needing to rest during any program option will be provided with a mat to rest on.

Outdoor Play will be offered in both the center base and home base options. Weather conditions will be monitored for temperature, threatening weather, wind chill/humidity, ozone warnings, pollen, etc. Staff will provide indoor gross motor activities if children cannot go outside. It is important for children to come to school dressed appropriately for play and investigation during the school day.

Staff/Child Ratios

Centers will not exceed the following state required ratios: 2:8 Toddlers (18 months- 2 years)

1:12 Young Preschoolers (3 years – 4 years)

1:14 Older Preschoolers (4 years until eligible for Kindergarten)

Active Supervision of Children in Head Start Centers

CAW/M enforces a never alone policy. Staff members are not to be left alone with any child. No child shall be left alone or unsupervised at any time, including nap/quiet time.

CAW/M staff use active supervision to ensure children remain engaged and within visual and auditory supervision at all times. The teachers are directly responsible for the safety of all children present in the center. Please assist the staff by supervising your non-enrolled children and following all safety postings/parent directions while visiting/participating in CAW/M head start programs.

Family Visitors should never be alone with the child(ren). If an emergency occurs that places the Family Visitor in this situation, the Family Visitor will first try to reach another adult in the home. If no one is available, a call will be placed to authorities/emergency contacts depending on the situation.

Child Guidance & Management

CAW/M staff will assist children to become responsible, cooperative, and self-disciplined through Conscious Discipline®. If there is a need for additional support, a plan will be developed with both the family and the staff involved. Staff will guide each child to learn and develop social skills necessary to successfully live in the world. Staff will follow all ODCY requirements for managing behaviors of children in the classroom/home visits/socializations.

Young children learn through their experiences and through play. Teachers encourage children to explore language, literacy, math, and science through their everyday activities. Children are assessed a minimum of three times per year in the areas of math, language, literacy, health, physical development, social emotional development, and cognition.

Teachers individualize learning activities to support each child's needs. Staff will also complete developmental and social/emotional screenings with families for each individual child. The outcome of these results will assist in making future educational decisions for your child.

Staff will work together with families to support children who are transitioning between programs within CAW/M Head Start program, as well as moving into their school careers. Families participating in center base programs will be offered two home visits and two parent teacher conferences per year to meet with staff around child's development and growth.

Families participating in the home base program will have weekly visits to discuss child's development and growth. Families can contact staff to establish additional meetings as needed.

A mental health consultant will make social/emotional observations in each of the agency's classrooms on a bi-weekly basis. The consultant is available to assist the staff, children and parents with any areas of behavioral concern. Referrals for families to meet with the consultant can be made upon request.

Community Action Wayne/Medina is dedicated to serving under-resourced children through high quality programming. Our objective is to create an environment, in the classroom, that is focused on supporting children's mental, social and emotional wellness. Learning to regulate emotions is a complex process requiring many complex skills. Community Action Wayne/Medina, with the support of the Conscious Discipline, works to assist all children with their social/emotional advancement. We strive to make our classrooms a place where all children feel safe, secure, and loved. In the past few years, we have seen an increase in behavioral concerns. In the case of extreme behaviors, where the safety of your child, and other children the classroom or teaching staff are a concern, our multidisciplinary team will work alongside you to come up with a solution to help your child be successful within our Head Start Programs. Some options may be temporary placement in our Home-Based program where your family will receive one-on-one services from a qualified home visitor, or a modification to your child's daily/weekly class schedule. We will work with you to explore additional Health and Mental Health services to assist you and your family while supporting your child.

Some examples of behaviors that are considered more extreme are:

- Pinching, hitting, or kicking that leaves a mark
- Pulling hair
- Biting
- Spitting on others
- Self-harming behaviors
- Throwing or knocking over furniture
- Sexualized behaviors
- Leaving the classroom without an adult

All of CAW/M's centers participate in the Step Up to Quality Program. Step Up to Quality is a program through the Ohio Department of Children and Youth that certifies a program exceeds the minimum standards for child-care.

Curriculum

CAW/M's Child Development programs use a research-based curriculum to ensure developmentally appropriate experiences are being offered to all children to learn through play.

Center Base Curriculum

Frog Street Curriculum – Frog Street Toddler and PreK center-based curricula is a comprehensive curriculum aligned to Head Start Early Learning Outcome Framework. It is designed to meet the needs of

all learners while supporting age-appropriate learning domains. Conscious Discipline strategies are imbedded to build a strong social emotional foundation from which children can learn to manage feelings and solve conflicts which is critical to school readiness.

Home Base Curriculum

Home Base program options use several curricula models collaboratively to support agency expectations and meet EHS and HS guidelines. Frog Street's Love & Learn and Frog Street's Preschool curriculums are used in addition to components of Growing Great Kids (GGK). Both Frog Street and GGK are comprehensive parenting, attachment, health/wellness, child development and family strengthening curriculum models which foster and support the growth of secure attachment relationships. The addition of Frog Street curricula aligns with the essence of CAWM home visit expectations/procedures and current practices. Conscious Discipline is embedded into curriculum in a meaningful intentional way to support secure parent-child relationships.

CAW/M families represent a diverse make-up throughout the programs. In order to honor each family's cultures and beliefs, holidays/birthdays will not be celebrated in the centers or home base programs.

CAW/M does not offer transportation provided field trips. Routine walking field trips, and classroom visitors are encouraged to increase learning experiences for all children.

Child Support Plans

Community Action Wayne/Medina is dedicated to serving under-resourced children through high quality programing. Our objective is to create an environment, in the classroom, that is focused on supporting child mental, social and emotional wellness. Learning to regulate emotions is a complex process that requires many skills. Community Action Wayne/Medina, with the support of the Conscious Discipline curriculum, works to assist all children on their social/emotional advancement. In the case of extreme behaviors, where the safety of your child, and other children the classroom or teaching staff are a concern, a Child Support Plan will be created. A Child Support Plan is a document created when a child is identified exhibiting behaviors/emotions/social skills that may be interfering with their engagement in the classroom environment. Community Action Wayne/Medina staff and the family will work together on developing a plan to support the child. The Child Support Plan creates a strong cohesive approach to helping your child develop the necessary skills to be successful in not only the learning environment, but in their life journey.

Water Safety

Younger children may be provided with water play opportunities at the center which may include sprinklers. Childcare staff members will review water safety rules with children each time they participate in water activities. A system for checking to ensure that each child is safe when in the water will be in place. The center shall obtain written permission from the parent or guardian. The written permission shall be signed and dated by the parent and be on file for review.

Parent, Family, Community Engagement Services

Head Start and Early Head Start use a two-generational approach to school readiness. CAW/M believes that parents/guardians are the key to the success of the program. A family's time, skills, and ideas are valuable, and their participation is encouraged. Families will find there are many ways they can be engaged with the program. They are encouraged to participate whenever possible in activities at the center, and/or

home base programs which include parenting curriculum, special events, parent committee, policy council, parent meetings, etc.

Family Service Specialists will also schedule a minimum of two home visits with families to participate in goal setting and review the status of completion of goals and to follow up on referrals.

Volunteers

As individuals volunteer, they are keeping a promise of hope for future children to laugh, play, learn & love. Through their time, thoughtfulness, and kindness, families grow, children blossom, and communities thrive, and funding is made possible for Head Start. This time spent is called “Non-federal match” which is a way CAW/M collects time and monetary amounts per donation. These donations add up until our non-fed match has been met. If a program does not meet their goal funding, services could be lost. In order for credit to be given, individuals must record their time, donations, etc. on a Non-Federal Match form, and turn it in to a Teacher, Family Service Specialist, or Family Visitor or other staff members every month.

Individuals can volunteer on a regular basis or for one-time experience. Opportunities can be designed to meet their schedule. To prove there is community support, we are required to keep records of the amount of time, mileage, and/or goods donated to the program. See a Family Service Specialist/Family Visitor for more ways you can volunteer. A few examples of opportunities to volunteer are listed below:

- Spend time in your child’s classroom
- Work on child goals at home
- Governance activities in Policy Council
- Organize the library

Due to insurance and state rules about staff/child ratios, we can’t allow any siblings to come with their parents to the classroom.

Parents as Advocates

As a parent, I:

- Will be welcomed, will have the opportunity to participate, and give input for parent meetings/activities along with parent committee meetings, events and activities.
- Will choose whether or not I participate in program activities without fear of endangering my child's right to be in the program.
- Will be informed regularly about my child's progress and any guidance given to support my child.
- Will be treated with respect and dignity, as well as treat others with the same respect and dignity.
- Will learn about the Head Start program, how it operates, and will assist in the planning and carrying out of programs designed to increase my skills and knowledge of Head Start.
- Will receive updates around the operation of the program through my Policy Council representative.
- Have the ability to request my child's record. The parent/guardian is to complete a records request with the Family Service Specialist/Family Visitor.

It is the expectation of our Head Start program:

- Parents/guardians will not leave any children unattended in the building or in vehicles.
- Parents/guardians will treat others with respect and kindness, including staff, children, other parents, or visitors. We ask that you refrain from shouting and displays of anger to and in front of children and adults on the Head Start premises. At no time will cursing, abusive language and name calling be acceptable and may result in immediate termination of services.
- All parents/guardians will establish a "hold hand" policy with their children when walking between the parking lot and the building for safety reasons.
- Parents/guardians will address misbehaviors of their own children attending a Head Start function or classroom in a "positive way." No physical punishment of children is allowed, this includes but is not limited to, striking your child or cursing at your child at a school function or classroom.
- If a parent or family has a disagreement or problem with another parent or family member at a Head Start function or classroom, the problem will be addressed with staff. We ask that you are respectful and courteous as we assist you through this issue. If a problem cannot be solved with the staff, feel free to contact the Operations Manager for your area at 330-264-8677 or 330-723-2229.

Failure to follow the Head Start expectations:

- First Occurrence - parent/guardian will be asked to review the Head Start expectations.
- Second Occurrence - parent/guardian will be asked to have a meeting with Head Start staff, to discuss strategies with possible outcome being asked to create an Individual Action plan to assist the parent/guardian in upholding the Head Start expectations.
- Third Occurrence – If parent/guardian does not follow the Individual Action plan, the Operations Manager/Social Service Manager will follow up with parent/guardian to communicate course of action, up to and including removal from all center/home base activities.

Grievance Procedure Policy

To give you, the parent/guardian, an opportunity to find an answer to problems or concerns that you may have during the time your child is in the program, please see the guidelines below.

- If you have an education or disabilities related concern, contact the Lead Teacher/Family Visitor.
- If you have a Family/Community Partnerships concern, contact your Family Service Specialist.

- For family-related questions, ask the Associate Director of Child and Family Services.
- For food service-related questions, ask the Food Service Supervisor.
- If you do not get your problem or concern solved, or you don't want to talk to the staff listed above, you can contact the Central Office Wooster 330-264-8677 or 1-800-477-8677 or Medina Office 330-723-2229 and ask for the Operations Manager.
- If you do not get your problem or concern solved, call Central Office Wooster 330-264-8677 or 1-800-477-8677 and ask for the Vice President of Programs.

Privacy of Records

Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA)

In accordance with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) any time Community Action Wayne/Medina (CAW/M) requests information from another entity, CAW/M will ask you for written permission. This

release of information form will act as your consent for CAW/M to release, obtain, and exchange information with any third party. You and/or your child's confidential information is protected by federal law. CAW/M will never disclose your confidential information unless it falls under the following:

Exceptions for disclosure:

- The disclosure is required by court order.
- The disclosure is made to medical personnel in a medical emergency.
- The disclosure is made if there is a threat of bodily harm to self and/ or others.
- The disclosure is made to appropriate state and local officials for suspected child abuse and neglect.
- The disclosure is made, if required by law, to any government agency conducting reviews, audits, and investigations, civil or criminal proceedings.

All staff and volunteers sign a confidentiality statement binding them to keep all information confidential. CAW/M upholds your confidentiality to the utmost discretion and has employee policies that forbid staff from disclosing confidential information.

Parent's Right to Contest Records

Legal parents/guardians have the right to contest their child's education record. If a parent/guardian wishes to contest their child's record, the parent/guardian is to contact the Associate Director of Child and Family Services at CAW/M Central Office.

Security Cameras

To ensure the safety and security of all children, staff, parents, as well as the security of the building, CAW/M centers may be equipped with interior and/or exterior 24-hour audio/video surveillance and security cameras. These cameras may be located in classrooms, hallways, outdoor play areas, and/or other common outdoor areas. The cameras are intended to help promote the safety and security of people and property and can assist CAW/M staff in reviewing an incident.

CAW/M insists on protecting the privacy of all children, parents, and staff. Therefore, our surveillance system/security cameras are for internal purposes only. CAW/M does not permit parents to view or obtain copies of recordings. With proper procedural documentation, CAW/M will cooperate with law enforcement

by providing access to and/or copies of surveillance videos when and if necessary. Security camera recordings are periodically deleted, as they are on a system with a limited amount of storage.

Community Resource Guide

The guide is a comprehensive listing of community resources, agencies, programs and services available to individuals, families and children within the counties of Wayne and Medina. A Family Service Specialist/Family Community Wellness Specialist or Family Visitor will help individuals locate resources and provide confidential referrals to agencies providing services such as food stamps, clothing, employment assistance, housing, mental health, domestic violence, substance abuse, counseling, etc.

We understand that many families face challenges related to mental health and substance use. Please know that you are not alone, and we are here to support you. Our Head Start program is committed to creating a safe and nurturing environment for your children and providing resources for parents in need.

If you are experiencing difficulties, we encourage you to reach out to your Family Service Specialist or Family Visitor for help. We can connect you with local mental health services, counseling, and support groups. Your well-being is important to us, and we are dedicated to helping you navigate these challenges.
