STORIES OF MPAC

SINGLE MOTHER RETURNS TO WORK

The Action Fund supported a recently single mother of five who had no license and minimal transportation options. We helped her register and pay for driving classes, worked with a local church to donate a vehicle, and made safety repairs. The client is now able to transport her children to school and activities, and she has returned to work!

HVAC Classes Offer a Second Chance

We worked with our local probation department to support a young man who was interested in a career in HVAC, yet could not afford the classes and certification exam. He is now enrolled in the adult education program at the career center, and already has employment prospects!

FROM UNHOUSED TO Employed and Safe

The Action Fund supported a single father who was living in his vehicle with his daughter. CAWM assisted him in gaining employment, an interim hotel stay, and securing a market rate apartment. He is thriving at his job, and his daughter is safe and secure.

HOT WATER HEATER THREATENS HEALTH & SAFETY

The Action Fund assisted a family by replacing a leaking hot water heater that was causing health and safety concerns. This family lived without running water for three weeks. While employed and surviving, the family did not have the savings needed for the repairs. Our partner plumber was able to replace the unit and address other minor issues in one day!

GAS & CAR REPAIRS

The Action Fund has assisted over 400 families with fuel assistance supporting transportation to school, medical appointments, prosocial activities, and employment.

We have been able to support 71 families who were just above the income eligibility criteria for our formal car repair program. As a result of the repairs, families report being able to attend work, school, out of county medical appointments, and other critical needs.
